## Thoughts from the Manse



Although we have got off lightly, Storm Doris has made headlines throughout Britain in recent days: pictures of waves crashing against piers, roads and motorways blocked by masses of snow, tragedies and accidents and thousands of homes without heating and electricity in challenging weather conditions: one could say that “Doris” gave the country quite a battering and who could be blamed for pulling the duvet over their heads and for staying put until the worst is over?

It is not only literally, that we are hit by tempestuous weather; these are stormy and dangerous times for this country. The House of Commons has heatedly debated the government's white paper setting out the conditions for leaving the European Union and the bill to trigger article 50. This has met with equally hot debates in the House of Lords, who for the first time in years threaten to rebel against the decisions of the House of Commons, many members wanting to amend the existing bill to include the right for EU citizens to stay in this country and the Parliament's right to shape the negotiations and decisions of so-called “Brexit”.

At first sight it may seem as if the church would get off lightly in this debate, does not need to be involved, that we can pull the duvet over our heads and weather the storm. But is that so? I believe that our church, our faith is deeply rooted in this world, and in this particular debate it means that we have a Biblical mandate to be hospitable to strangers - not just to European citizens, but to strangers all over the world, we have a Biblical mandate to build God's kingdom, a kingdom that does not have borders and boundaries, we have a Biblical mandate to safeguard the weak and the vulnerable against the autocratic will of the powerful – and the houses of parliament are such a safeguard – or should be.

**Cont/**Where that mandate is endangered, we cannot just turn our heads away, we cannot just wait for sunnier weather – we have to advocate God’s law, we have to face the storm. Yet, where we do face the storm, where we dare to speak up for the weak, the vulnerable, the stranger, there we can rely on God’s promise, made through the prophet Isaiah: “When you pass through the waters I will be with you and when you pass through the rivers they will not sweep over you” (Is 43,2)

### Blue Peter Badge

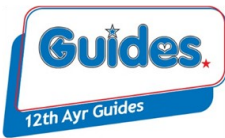

Dawn taught the girls some line dancing, which after a bit of practice turned out rather successfully. First St James' Church and next, the Wild West I think?

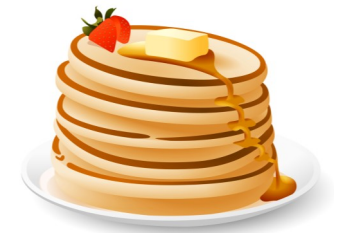
